Located on Florida's scenic Gulf Coast, approximately 45 minutes from Tallahassee, the non-profit GSML Aquarium is "where the sea reveals its secrets." While many aquariums feature large, charismatic marine mammals and sharks, Gulf Specimen focuses on the fascinating world of the small. Over 50 saltwater exhibits—including numerous touch tanks—give visitors the opportunity to learn about and experience the wonders of the sea in a uniquely intimate way. Our exhibits are always changing; the marine biological supply operation that supports the aquarium provides a constant flow of animals coming through the lab. Promoting responsible stewardship of our fragile marine ecosystems is key to our mission. We are a founding member of Florida's Sea Turtle Stranding and Salvage Network, and our turtle hospital provides care to several species of sea turtles.

The aquarium is open to the public seven days a week, and special guided tours are available. Our travelling Sea Mobile can bring a sampling of the aquarium to your classroom, festival, special event, or private party. We offer an Aquatic Adventures Summer Camp for children aged 5-12 during the month of June.

From 1656 to 1704, Mission San Luis served as the principal village of the Apalachee and was the Spaniards' westernmost military, religious, and administrative capital. 

Come explore 180 years of Florida history at Goodwood... Stroll the gardens beneath sprawling oaks and visit the Main House to get a glimpse of time gone by. Goodwood began as a corn and cotton plantation in the 1830s. By the early 20th century, the property's agricultural emphasis had declined, but the Main House continued to serve as an elegant private residence. Today, the property tells the stories of all the people who lived and worked at Goodwood through time, including territorial Florida, statehood, the Civil War and Reconstruction, and the Country Estate era.
